## Synopsis

In 1974, a twelve year old boy learns to speak up in a society based on censorship, at a Portuguese Catholic seminary. In the midst of the children's micro community, José decides to express himself about an unjust situation that affects him and his friends. He confronts authority so he can watch a very important football game and puts himself at risk because of how strongly he feels about his opinion. His actions of rebelliousness reflect the Carnation Revolution that the entire population of Portugal went through in order to regain some of the most precious basic human rights such as freedom of speech. The resolution of his defiance against Father Joaquim turns out to be a rather different outcome from the one José expected.



### Director's Statement by Ana Pio

*Eden* is a necessary film for us to keep talking about basic human rights that we take for granted within what appears to be a free society.

The idea came to me as a combination of several elements that I wanted to explore as a filmmaker. The innocence of childhood combined with a 1974 Portuguese harsh environment of strict rules, seemed like a perfect contrast to tell a contextually real story — my father's - with a deep and raw message about freedom of speech and rebellion against oppression that we can apply to nowadays society.

It's a journey you experience with a twelve year old boy that is just as confused by his surroundings as the audience, ultimately sharing feelings of inner peace.

*Eden* defies what freedom means to us and the representation of the ultimate place of happiness: the Garden of Eden. It questions how this place can be within each one of us, and not merely in another life, when fulfilling dreams that can be as apparently simple as being able to speak our minds.




### Location

#### Fundão Seminary

Founded in 1916, the Fundão Minor Seminary in Portugal allowed children from poor families the opportunity of having an education, from arts to sciences, having taught numerous influential names of these fields. Throughout 100 years of history, this building has now been a shelter for orphan children, a shelter for refugees from the Portuguese colonies and a film set for *Eden*.

#### Monserrate Park

The Park and Palace of Monserrate, in Sintra, are unique representatives of 19th century eclecticism. The gardens have received species from all corners of the world, making this a very exotic space with peculiar nature, perfect for the representation of a Garden of Eden.

#### **Manuel Francisco** (Pedro)


